

Meet the Adjudicators



PETER STOLL

Known for his virtuoso energy on stage as well as an easy and entertaining way of speaking with the audience, Peter Stoll teaches clarinet, chamber music, performance and education studies, and the Business of Music at the University of Toronto's Faculty of Music, and is a frequent performer with orchestral and chamber ensembles in southern Ontario. Also a very popular adjudicator up to the national level, he has worked across Canada and in the United States. Peter is particularly known for his enthusiastic, positive comments and detailed suggestions to young musicians.

Tours as soloist and with various ensembles have taken him across Europe, to Russia and to the United States. Recent performance highlights have included chamber concerts in Japan and a tour of three Chinese cities, as well as at the International Clarinet Association's conference in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. In 2016 Peter was featured on a recording with members of the Canadian Brass, and in May 2018 he was the soloist in noted American wind ensemble composer Brian Balmages' concerto "Escapades", with the composer conducting. In 2019 Peter shared in the win of a Dora Mavor Moore award for Best Ensemble-Opera in Toronto.

Over the past 30 years Peter has been invited to adjudicate at over 150 local festivals across

Canada. Fluent in both languages, he has heard countless bands, orchestras, and woodwind, brass and percussion solos and ensembles coastto-coast. Beyond the local level, he had judged at the finals of 15 Provincial competitions, and has been asked three times to serve as the woodwind adjudicator for the national finals of the Federation of Canadian Music Festivals, most recently for the 'virtual Nationals' in summer 2021.

Peter is also a member of the Royal Conservatory of Music's National College of Examiners, where he is the area Specialist for Winds, and was the Chief Compiler of the 2014 edition of the clarinet examination syllabus. His website is www.peterstoll.ca.



SONIA KLIMASKO

Sonia Klimasko is a graduate of the University of Toronto, holding a degree in Performance. Ms. Klimasko maintains an active teaching studio in addition to being a popular adjudicator and clinician. She is in demand as a chamber and orchestral musician and has played first violin with the National Ballet of Canada Orchestra for the past 43 years.

Ms. Klimasko's extensive performing career ranges from performances in the Imperial Room of the Royal York with Tony Bennett, and James Brown, the Bob Hope Orchestra, as Concertmaster for famed tenor Jan Pearce's Fiddle on the Roof and Assistant Concertmaster for The Wizard of Oz and Anne of Green Gables at the Toronto Elgin Theater. She has enjoyed playing Phantom of the Opera as well as with the ever popular Prince Edward Island's production of Anne of Green Gables.

Over the past 30 years, Sonia has performed with Hamilton Philharmonic, Windsor Symphony, Scarborough Philharmonic, New Toronto Chamber Players, Thunder Bay Symphony, Toronto Lyric Theater Orchestra, Kingston Symphony, Niagara Symphony, Toronto Pops Orchestra, Toronto Philharmonic, Esprit, Atlantic Symphony, Oshawa Symphony, Royal Winnipeg Ballet Orchestra, Les Grand Ballet Canadienne Orchestra, and Opera Mississauga. She has recorded for numerous commercials, CBC and Murray Schafer Epic RA for Centerdisc. She has performed two seasons with the Northern Lights Music Festival in Ajijic, Mexico and is an alumnae of the National Youth Orchestra and Ontario Youth Concert Band.

Sonia Klimasko has held the positions of string instructor at the Bishop Strachan School, Cardinal Carter Academy for the Arts, University of Toronto schools as well as string consultant with the York Region

Board of Education. She has presented workshops for the National Film Board, was a founding artist with the Inner City Angels, was on faculty for both the National String Academy in Ottawa and CAMMAC and recorded for CBC on Murray Schafer Epic RA for Centerdisc.

Her teachers have included John Moskalyk, David Mankovitz of the American String Quartet and Victor Martin, Concertmaster of the Madrid Symphony Orchestra. Her many scholarships and awards include a RCM Provincial Medal and the Chamber of Commerce Award for Excellence in the Arts which was awarded to Ms. Klimasko in 2004. Sonia Klimasko is an avid fan of pedagogical ideology and an enthusiastic and popular adjudicator and clinician. While maintaining an active performance career and teaching studio she always manages to find time for her passion for writing and is an award winning gardener and Half Ironman Triathlete. Ms. Potter holds a Bachelor's Degree in Piano Performance from the University of Western Ontario, and a Masters Degree in Piano Pedagogy and Performance from the University of Michigan. Academic positions held include Lecturer in Piano Pedagogy at the University of Michigan, and Coordinator of the All-State Program at the Interlochen Centre for the Arts. She has been recognized with several awards in both teaching and performing, including the Alice B. Kern Excellence in Teaching Award (University of Michigan), and the UWO Gold Medal.

Wendy has appeared as an accompanist and chamber musician for recitals at the University of Toronto, the Royal Conservatory of Music and throughout the GTA. She has also collaborated with the Scarborough Philharmonic Orchestra and the Toronto Wind Orchestra. As a member of the Canadian Music Festival Adjudicator's Association, her work as an adjudicator takes her on extensive travel throughout Canada, as does her role as a senior member of the College of Examiners for the Royal Conservatory of Music.

Ms. Potter is passionate about the importance of teaching and performing music by Canadian composers and is currently the coordinator of Contemporary Showcase Toronto. She is a long-time resident of the Beaches Area of Toronto where she has had the privilege of running a home-based studio as both a teacher and freelance musician for the past many years. Encouragement and validation are at the heart of her interactions with young people. She is committed to clear and knowledge-based communication while being inspired by her own students every day.

Patrick Feely has adjudicated local, national, and international guitar competitions including the Montreal International, Hnatyshyn Foundation, and Vancouver North Shore festivals and is a guitar specialist at the Royal Conservatory of Music where he assesses guitar candidates across Canada and the U.S., and mentors new examiners. His students have been accepted into undergraduate and graduate performance programs in North America and Europe and have won provincial, national, and international prizes at guitar competitions.

Patrick holds a Master of Music in Guitar Performance degree from the University of Toronto studying under Jeffrey McFadden and a Ph.D. in Music Education from the University of Western

Ontario. His research interests center on observational and self-regulated learning, assessment, measurement, and teaching large online guitar courses.

Patrick is currently Assistant Professor of Music Education in the Don Wright Faculty of Music at the University of Western Ontario and is the founder of the not-for-profit Guitar Society of Brantford where he is the Artistic Director and Director of Community Orchestra.



Meet the *H*djudicators



DR. CHARLENE PAULS

Dr. Charlene Pauls has enjoyed a varied musical career as a choral conductor, soprano soloist, clinician, adjudicator, academic, and pedagogue.

Charlene has appeared as a Soprano soloist on concert stages across Canada and internationally in Germany, England, France and Spain with notable conductors such as Robert Shaw, Bramwell Tovey, Frieder Bernius, and Helmuth Rilling.

Charlene maintains a private voice studio in Oakville, Ontario with a goal of fostering a love of singing through a range of repertoire and a sound grounding in vocal technique. Her students are professional singers, auditioning for competitions and academic music programs, preparing RCM exams, and singing for pure enjoyment. She frequently adjudicates for choral and vocal festivals across Canada, and presents research at conferences, including the National Association of Teachers of Singing (NATS) and Chorus America.

Over the course of her career, she has directed a wide range of adult, university and youth choirs. Under her

direction, choirs have won nationally at the CBC Amateur Canadian Choral Competition, World Choir Games gold medal standing (Riga, Latvia), and have appeared at the Canadian national choral conference "Podium". In 2018, she was thrilled to be awarded the Ontario Arts Council's Leslie Bell Prize, which "recognizes excellence in emerging conductors".

Since 2019, Dr. Pauls has been the Artistic Director of the <u>Guelph Chamber Choir</u>, an organization that has been a stalwart on the Canadian choral scene for over 40 years. The GCC presents a four-concert main season spanning works from larger orchestral/choral pieces to contemporary works and commissions. She is passionate about community engagement and has developed the "Sing Out" program that runs concurrently with the concert season creating programming aimed at developing youth musicians, connecting with seniors, and engaging with community partners.

She is the Associate Artistic Director of the 200-voice strong Oakville Choir for Children and Youth where she directs the "Chamber Voices" ensemble, an ambassadorial group selected from within the organization's senior singers.

Dr. Pauls holds a D.M.A. in Musical Arts (Vocal Performance) from the University of Toronto where she specialized in vocal pedagogy and a doctoral research dissertation on Bach's Cantata BWV 210. She received a Master's of Arts from McGill University (Voice - Early Music), and completed undergraduate degrees from the Universities of Winnipeg and Manitoba in theology, piano and voice.


Mission Statement
