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Meet the Adjudicators

AARON HODGSON

Trumpeter Aaron Hodgson has been praised for his "exquisite musicianship and assured composure" (International Trumpet Guild). A prize-winner in the Ellsworth Smith and OSM Standard Life competitions, Aaron has been broadcast nationally by CBC Radio and can be heard on orchestral recordings for Naxos and Analekta records. His solo album Inner Voice was released on Blue Griffin Recordings in 2017. Aaron is a founding member of Reverb Brass and the Carnyx Trio, and he has premiered over two dozen new solo and chamber works.

Aaron is a sought-after teacher and is Associate Professor at the Don Wright Faculty of Music, Western University, where he is currently a Teaching Fellow investigating innovative teaching practices in the field of studio pedagogy. He has taught master classes in Australia, Brazil, Colombia, Ecuador and across the United States. Aaron holds a Doctor of Musical Arts from Yale University.



JENNIFER SMELE, M.Mus., B.Mus., A.Mus., A.R.C.T., R.M.T.

Jennifer is active in the greater Toronto area as both a performer and teacher. She holds her Master's degree in Piano Performance/Pedagogy (University of Toronto), Bachelor of Music (University of Western Ontario), A.R.C.T. (Royal Conservatory of Music), and Associate diploma (Conservatory Canada). Throughout her studies, Jennifer was the recipient of several academic awards including the prestigious Ontario Graduate Scholarship. Her research centred around injury prevention and student retention.

Jennifer is a member of the Royal Conservatory of Music's College of Examiners and runs a studio in Brampton where she offers lessons in all genres. She has been a guest clinician at the University of Toronto and enjoys adjudicating throughout Canada. She recently introduced a workshop, "The Power of a Picture," which explores the use of imagery in piano teaching.

Jennifer has pursued studies in the field of Early Childhood Music Education as well as mindfulness practice in performance. She completed a collaborative piano internship in Oberaudorf, Germany as well as the musician mentorship program with the Canadian National Ballet. She enjoys Dalcroze Eurythmics which combine her passions for movement and improvisation.

A versatile pianist, Jennifer performs professionally at nursing homes, receptions, and weddings throughout Ontario. She enjoys collaborating with the Brampton Children's Chorus and with her cello duo partner, Jose Shapero. In her spare time, Jennifer loves to ballroom dance, write, and practice yoga. She has a very special place in her heart for little pianists and is grateful for the opportunity to nurture and pass on the love of music.

Lesley Andrew has made soloist appearances with many of Canada's finest orchestras and choirs, including the Vancouver, Windsor, Kitchener-Waterloo, Kingston, Hamilton, Guelph symphony orchestras, Weston Silver Band, Toronto Concert Band, Kitchener-Waterloo Chamber Orchestra, Brott Summer Music Festival, Stratford Summer Music, and the Shenandoah Bach Festival (VA, USA). Ms. Andrew's recordings have often been heard on CBC Radio. Known for her extraordinary vocal range and versatility in many genres of music, Ms. Andrew often 'switches hats', performing as the soprano soloist for one engagement and as the alto soloist for the next – from opera to show tunes, oratorio to jazz.

Ms. Andrew's professional activities have included directing and teaching appointments at George Brown College (Director of Vocal Music), Wilfrid Laurier University (Opera - stage director), the Universities of Windsor (Vocal Pedagogy, Studio Voice; Faculty of Music, and The Creative Process;

School of Dramatic Arts) and Western Ontario (Studio Voice, Opera - stage director, Shakespearean drama). As a pedagogue, Ms. Andrew is very involved with the W Ross Macdonald School for the Visually Impaired in Brantford, Ontario, where she creates and directs drama programming for exceptional children. While maintaining a full teaching schedule in her private studios (London & Windsor), Ms. Andrew continues to work as an actor, singer, soloist, collaborative recital artist/raconteur, stage director, adjudicator, and motivational speaker.



MARGOT JEWELL



Goals and Objectives


- To celebrate the art of teaching, study, composition and performance of music.



Each participant will receive a comment sheet and a mark from the adjudicator with an award certificate indicating a standing according to the following scale of marks: Gold standing....85 marks or higher Silver standing.....80 to 84 marks Bronze standing......75 to 79 marks Or Participant

**Note: Introductory level, Family Classes, Adult Students and participants 7 years of age and under will not receive marks or standings but will be awarded certificates of participation.

The certificates and adjudication sheets will be presented to the participants immediately following the oral adjudication of the class or group of classes. There can be several of the same standings awarded in each class according to the marks assigned by the adjudicator.

The adjudicator is advised to add five marks for pieces which are memorized.

Note that memorization is not required in the following classes: Studies, Duets or Trios, Adult Students, Creative Music, Sight Reading, any Accompaniment classes, Improvisation, or Quick Study. If a participant chooses to use their music, they are asked to provide a second copy for the adjudicator to use during the

performance.

Trophies will be awarded to outstanding participants in these divisions on the recommendation of the adjudicator. All trophies will be presented at the "Festival Encores" concert on Monday, May 5th, 2025 at 7:00 p.m. at the historic Orillia Opera House.


